41. BANK MANDATE

For the purposes of updating the bank mandate it was **agreed**, to add N Brand and remove A Jolliffe. It was **resolved** that the authorised signatories in the current mandate, for the accounts listed in section 2, be changed in accordance with sections 5 and 6 and the current mandate will continue as amended,

42. HIGHWAY MATTERS

- (1) Dog bin for the cycle track: It was noted that the offer of 50% of the cost of purchase and installation of the dog bin had been made to Sustrans, who are now arranging installation.
- (2) Parking at Silver Street It was noted that all five garages were to be repaired and re-let. The Clerk to put a request to Aster that the terms and conditions be amended to state that garages should be used for vehicles and asked to optimise space to allow as much parking outside the garages as possible. It was noted that parking at Silver Street is a much larger issue than the garages alone.

43. PLAYING FIELD

- (1) Signage for the eight overflow parking spaces Agreed to position the sign on posts to the right of the entrance to the grasscrete area as vehicles drive in, angled to face drivers. The sign, in white lettering on black, would be finalised by Cllr Lewis and brought to the next meeting with costs.
- (2) Quote for infill of top soil beneath the swing seat Nick Taylor had suggested the longer term solution of a frame for woodchips beneath the nest swing, the fireman's pole and the zip wire. Agreed that this seemed a better solution and Nick Taylor to be asked to quote.
- (3) Grass-crete rising slightly by the slide nearest the zip wire This would be resolved within the work outlined above.
- (4) Grass cutting of the playing field and strimming of Jack and Jill hill a specification was amended and it was **agreed** to go out to tender. In the meantime the Village Hall Committee's concern that the lawn mower was damaging paving slabs was noted.

KILMERSDON ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Minutes of the Kilmersdon Annual Parish Meeting held on Thursday 21st June 2018 at 7.30pm at Kilmersdon Village Hall

Present: Cllr R Morse (Chair), Cllrs S Gibbs, D Hudson and K Lewis, five members of the public

1. Apologies

Apologies for absence were received from Cllr M Pullin (Somerset CC), Cllrs N Brand and R Butt (Kilmersdon Parish Council).

To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 3rd July 2017
 The minutes were proposed as a true record by Cllr Hudson, seconded by Cllr Gibbs and agreed.

3. Welcome and overview of the year by the Chair of the Parish Council

Cllr Morse welcomed everyone to the meeting and outlined the fact that it had been a busy year with lots going on.

4. Talks on local issues

The meeting welcome Tony Najdoski of the broadband providers Truespeed, which offers a full fibre network to deliver ultra fast broadband to the parish. Encouraged by local support, if the scheme goes ahead in Kilmersdon they would be able to offer free broadband for life to the Village Hall and the school. The Chairman thanked Mr Najdoski for attending and more information was available outside the meeting.

5. General forum for questions from members of the public

Sewerage treatment works – there was a query on what is happening at these works. It was confirmed that there is a small amount of work still to be done and the road needs to be sorted out.

Neighbourhood Plan – this is progressing with a small nucleus of local people coming together to form a working group. Anyone interested in taking part should contact the Clerk.

Parking provision in the village – This is a problem particularly when there is a function at the hall, is there a possibility for more provision for example in the field opposite? Parking in the field opposite is dependent upon the landowner's permission and the farmer. There is a sign going up reminding people of the eight extra spaces within the Village hall car park.

There being no further questions the meeting ended at 8.20pm.
