Hugh's Views on Wines

Recently I was introduced to a delicious Portuguese white wine, a Mimo Moutinho Laureiro, the Branca of Portugal. The flavours of citrus and tropical fruits were much in evidence and this wine, which is very popular in Portugal, is now being exported to England. If you find it, buy it! Portuguese wine has been exported to us for centuries, particularly during the Anglo-Portuguese alliance against France in the latter half of the 17th century, but gradually the popularity waned until very recently when the Portuguese government was behind a concerted marketing drive to the European Union and also to England. Thus we find some of Portugal's wines on our supermarket shelves A happy event indeed!

Though we think of the Douro valley as the epicentre of Port production, a large amount of table wine is also produced, chiefly on the slopes of the valley. Various varieties of grapes are grown according to the altitude. Too high, too cold with Atlantic gales causing havoc. Too low, too sweet to have much character. As well as the excellent white wines, reds and following the fashion roses are available, a far cry from the Mateus rosés of the 60's and 70's, the popular gargle of the students of the day!

The Vinha do Fava, a red from the region of Setubal at 14.5% alcohol, is a heady wine with cherry and spicy flavours. That amount of alcohol is perhaps too much, but present fashion dictates otherwise. The rosés come in beautifully shaped bottles, by the way, and are not to be sneezed at. A proper account of Portugal's wine should of course include its offshore island to the west, namely Madeira, which deserves another article and will get one deo volente!

Production of Madeira is centuries old and indeed Madeira continues to improve seemingly forever, so do not throw away a partially consumed bottle as the wine will retain its strength and appeal for a long time, months even!

KILMERSDON WASSAIL

Thankfully the day dried up by lunchtime to give us a dry Wassail. We had a good band of Wassailers, 60 in number plus two dogs. The Village Band led us to the Community Orchard where a few words were spoken on the history of Wassail before Martin crowned 11-year-old Olivia Merko the 2023 Kilmersdon Wassail Queen.

This year a welcome addition to the Ceremony was the Blessing of the trees by our new Vicar, Rev. Clarissa Cridland. Our Queen placed some toast in the tree for Robin Goodfellow, the good spirit of the orchard, she then poured cider around the base of the tree to give back to the tree what it has given us last year and to remind it



that we require more apples to produce more cider this year. We all sang the Kilmersdon Wassail Song and then the incantation at the end of which the 12 bore was fired up through the branches to drive away the evil spirits which may be lurking in the orchard and to wake up the trees for another season of fruitfulness. Finally the Wassail Cup of mulled cider, spices, cinnamon, demerara sugar and laced with brandy was passed around for everyone to take a drink. This year we went back to all drinking from the same Wassail Mug as I assured everyone that my cider kills all known germs! The Village Band led us all back to the Old School House where we performed the ceremony all over again but the added Burning the Ashen Faggot. Our Queen paraded the Faggot around the circle of Wassailers before handing it to 85 year old Alban Bunting, who was the oldest man within the company, to place it on the fire. During the procedure free cider was available to whoever wanted to help themselves and apple cake was handed around to all the company. The Parish Chest was made available to anyone who wanted to make a donation, the result of this was a wonderful £125.53 for the Hanging Baskets which you will see throughout the village in the summer.

Hi Everyone,

It is spring and hedges have started growing again. I've been the Kilmersdon Parish Footpath Warden for some years (technically now the Parish Paths Liaison Officer), however last Autumn we moved to the USA. Is

there anybody out there who would like to take the job on?

Practically speaking the role entails cutting back the hedges on the parish footpath network 3 or 4 times a year. Most are accessible from the roadside and the process takes a few hours if you do it all at once. I used to drive around with my hedge cutters in the car and easily do them all in an afternoon, but obviously you can spread them out across walks if you prefer.

I have maps of the network and can brief you on each point that needs to be cut. If you find blockages that are too big to tackle yourself, there is a responsive team at Somerset




County Council who will sort. There are also a few others in the parish who keep some paths clear. Overall, it's a simple role and a nice way of helping maintain the parish.




